Minutes of the Regular Meeting – February 16, 2010

A Regular meeting of the Chichester School Board was held at the Administration Building, 401 Cherry Tree Road, Boothwyn, Pennsylvania, on February 16, 2010. The meeting was called to order at 7:38 p.m. Board President Howard Adams apologized for the late start due to an executive session that was held before the meeting.
