Author, Title of Item. [Online] Available <http://address/filename>, date of document or download.

Sample:

E-Mail

Author of email message. Subject line of the message. [Online] Available email: student@address.edu from author@address.edu, date of message.

Sample:

Roberts, Eric. **Nile REsearch Project Results**. [Online] Available email: [student 1 @ smallvillehigh. edu](mailto:student1@smallvillehigh.edu) from [ert @ informns.k12.mn.us](mailto:ert@informns.k12.mn.us), February 3, 1996.

Bibliographic Entry CD-ROM

The citation should be written as usual, with author (contributer), article title, Source underlined, and publication date. However, at the end, there should be an annotation to indicate the name of the product and its electronic format.

Sample:

Ito, Philip J., "Papaya", **World Book Encyclopedia**, 1994 ed. **Information Finder**, CD-ROM version of the World Book Encyclopedia.
